SPP starting Winter 26/27 study soon, will be emailing with inputs to study to request validation and updates from Participants. – Operations Workgroup – Beau B. W24-25 has started, doing monthly ops program reports. WPP team meeting with consultants to get settlements set up. - Storage Hydro User Group - Steve B. 7. Change Control Process - Upcoming NTFPs Reminder to the group that the CRF form is up on the website and is accepting 10:16 both NTFPs and requests to discuss Concepts. WPP inquires whether the RAPC would want a venue to discuss what they would like to be put in. In discussion, SRP is aware of and participating in some sidebars. BPA as well. Will discuss at next RAPC. **New Business** 8. RAPC 2025 Scheduling Preparing to put 2025 meetings on calendar. Keeping bi-weekly 2 hours, seeking to cancel when possible. Also seeking to pre-schedule 1-2 in-person meetings for RAPC – one in SW, one in NW. Likely near September Board meeting in Portland 10:25 and Board meeting in DSW in March. In discussion, BPA suggests saving topics for in-person meetings (and having fewer virtual meetings in run-up). Have key dates - binding commitment and PRC workplan that will require virtual meetings, but once in-person meetings are on the calendar WPP can consider elimination of redundant meetings. 9. Operations Data Granularity In 2024-EP-1, agreed WRAP would supply resource level info – currently aggregated and only getting a few data points. Aiming to provide multi day, operating day, and actuals in a phased approach also with resource-by-resource basis. Can't do that without IDs to link to FS. In discussion: BPA has some concerns over market sensitivity and need of some of this data. Question the benefit from getting individual plant loads.

with analysis (using Uncertainty as an example). Not getting the same granularity when asking for after the fact data. Can't improve
calculations of uncertainty without more granularity – specifically for inputs to the sharing calculation.
BPA asks if WPP could instead ask Participants to save forecasts for a
period so that if there is a request data could be provided after the fact. After the fact data would mitigate concerns for Idaho.
 WPP has concerns over providing a data driven approach to uncertainty – no mechanism to commit others to store data in that way, and no ability to check in real time the cause of a large negative in the sharing calculation. Earliest rollout June 1st for Summer data.
PAC shares similar concerns to BPA. Question if WPP would consider
looking at top 10 solar or wind rather than every resource considering data requirements.
 WPP – small PURPA contracts are not an input to the sharing calculation. Concern over not being able to track data that is being aggregated
• PSE asks if the plan is to publish any of this info
 WPP – no – only accessible to WPP and SPP, per what was outlined in 2024-EP-1
 SRP is interested in discussing with vendors, timeline somewhat determinate on discussion availability. Would be helpful to have WPP engage with vendors. PNM – could WPP provide RAPC with a write up of what we're seeking to achieve. WPP – yes, next step.
10. Commercially Reasonable Efforts Discussion
In 2024-EP-1, committed to providing RAPC endorsed examples of commercially reasonable efforts – two that are and two that aren't. Must sign an attestation that you have made commercially reasonable efforts prior to use an ETD. WPP is seeking a few individuals to work on how to facilitate this conversation. BPA, Idaho, NVE volunteer to assist.
